- If you absolutely love it when a woman you don't know (or one you do know, like your wife/girlfriend) stares at you




Aggressively with that suggestive gaze simply because of the beauty of the color coordination of your statement jacket outfit, then this book is for you.

That list of course is by no means extensive. Some are private individuals and don't want to feature on it.



Because lazy is just not a word that features anywhere in your vocabulary. At all.




Image upgrade for a personal goal
